tion, etc. The latter will make it possible to properly manage the subsidy systems, produce the agricultural statistics and establish a monitoring-evaluation system.

"The country has already adopted a Vision of an Emerging Burundi in 2040-Developed Burundi in 2060 and the strategies are adopted following budgetary the discussions by the priority programs. We plan to organize a Round Table of development partners very soon and everyone will have their choice," said President Ndayishimiye, proud to be supported in his vast development project in Burundi. The Director of the ADB promised to finance the digitalization of the agricultural system to have the good statistics in order to enlighten the partners in agricultural development with all the information necessary for developing that sector.

Mrs. Nnenna Nwabufo appreciated the Prime Minister's involvement in the country's development to the extent that he goes on the ground to inquire about the state of execution and management of the projects financed by the development partners.

Agency, it had planned purchasing the equipment for the electrification of 20 centers in the country for the current budget year. After discussion, the Second Vice -President of the Senate was informed that that budget has not yet been used following the long process related to the award of the contract. With the equipment that that agency had in its stock, 15 centers are being electrified. Honorable Nkurunziza encouraged the concerned authorities and asked them to make an effort to the electrify remaining five.

As for the Matyazo health center, it was chosen as a pilot center by the Nyakiriza sun project which intends to provide the solar energy for more than 250 health centers. After the visit, the Second Vice President appreciated that project.

During the visit to ECOFO Randa, Honorable Nkurunziza noted that the Nyakiriza sun project has another project that it is carrying out in schools with the school canteens, called "institutional kitchen shelters and improved homes" for reduce the quantity of the firewood and that school is among the beneficiaries of that project. That project was also well appreciated by the Second Vice President of the Senate because with the reduction of firewood, the environment will also be protected.

Regarding the visit to the pumping station which is of the capital importance for the country, it was noted that it is under the threat from the rising waters of Lake Tanganyika. (Senate)

Bubanza: 159 detainees released



s part of the implementation of the policy of the Head of State His Excellency Evariste Ndayishimiye of decongesting prisons, the Ministry of Justice Madame Domine Banyankimbona proceeded on Thursday March 21, 2024, to the release of 159 prisoners who had benefited the provisional release or conditional release at Bubanza prison.

That Bubanza prison which, when it was built, had a capacity to accommodate 200 inmates, currently has 454 inmates including 400 men, 50 women and 4 children.

According to the Attorney General of the Republic

Mr. Léonard Manirakiza, the public prosecutor's office, in its routine inspection work, organized an inspection campaign in detention centers and detainee files. That campaign resulted in the release of some of them.

The provisional and conditional release concerns the prisoners who have served 1/4 of their sentence, those who have committed the minor offenses and those who have completed their sentence, said the Attorney General of the Republic Mr. Leonard Manirakiza.

The Minister of Justice, Madame Domine Banyankimbona, advised the released detainees to behave well in those around them so as not to reoffend and return to the prison. She recommended that the locals welcome them and integrate them positively. The Minister asked the released prisoners to join the cooperatives to help in increasing the production with a view for achieving the vision of Burundi as an Emerging country in 2040 and a Developed country in 2060.

Minister Domine Banyankimbona called on judicial police officers and prosecutors to only take a person into the preventive detention if there is no other recourse or for the protection of the victim and the accused.

The Minister of Justice finally asked those responsible for the courts and tribunals to do their best for following up the cases so that the preventive detention is not long. (Senate)

The Ministry of Justice launches a project for the management of the land conflicts



n Friday March 22, 2024, the Ministry of Justice officially launched in Makamba, the new project "Justice for all in the management of the land conflicts", a project which results from collaboration between the Government of Burundi and the Kingdom of the Netherlands through its development agency RVO, and LADEC (Land Development Expertise Center) in charge of

implementing the project.

According to the Managing Director of LADEC Séverin Nibitanga, LADEC is a social enterprise working in the field of land governance for almost 6 years. Through all its research, capacity building or community development projects, LADEC serves the Burundian communities in search of equitable and secure access to the land and other natural resources, in search of development, dignity, harmonious cohabitation, in short in search of social peace.

The new project "Justice for all in the Management of Land Conflicts" (JTT-GCF) which will be managed by LADEC will cover the provinces of Makamba and Rutana and aims to contributing in the peaceful and optimal management of the land conflicts through the local mechanisms. , formal and informal.

That project also aims to contributing to the construction of a peaceful society, a society mobilized around the vision of an Emerging Burundi in 2040 and Developed in 2060, and is in the perfect alignment with the National Development Plan of Burundi PND2018_2027 specified the Managing Director of LADEC, Severin Nibitanga. He reminded that that phenomenon of the land conflict manifests itself particularly at the level of the residence courts where the land conflicts represent around 70% of the cases handled. The Councils of Notables, recently established community structures, will also be confronted with that phenomenon.

As part of the "Prevention and Resolution of the Land Conflicts" project, LADEC supports the Supreme Court in setting up a collection of land case law. That legal tool for justice professionals and litigants will be popularized in the provinces of Makamba and Rutana.

In his official launch speech of the "JTT-GCF" project, the Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of Justice Mr. Gervais Hajayandi indicated that the project has the ambition and ultimate objective of contributing significantly to the strengthening of peace and social cohesion by strengthening the local mechanisms responsible for managing the land conflicts on a daily basis. He specified that the activities of that project will mainly focus on information-training of justice actors involved in the management of the land conflicts, in particular the councils of the notables, courts and lawyers concerning the land theme and the content of that land jurisprudence. The project will also raise the awareness among the population on the functioning of the land conflict management mechanisms and provide the legal and judicial assistance to the vulnerable people.

The Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of Justice Mr. Gervais Hajayandi ended his remarks by thanking all the development partners who continue contributing in building a lawful and peaceful country, particularly the Kingdom of the Netherlands for that new project. (RTNB)

Celebration of the International Francophonie Week, 2024 edition



he Agence" Universitaire de la Francophonie (AUF)" in Burundi in collaboration with the University of Burundi, under the patronage of the Ministry of National Education and Scientific Research, organized a public conference on March 19, 2024 in Bujumbura., as part of the celebration of the international week of the Francophonie.

The Assistant to the Minister of National Education and Scientific Research, Mr. Herménegilde Burikukiye, indicated that the Ministry is delighted with the step taken for the promotion of education in Burundi. He specified that Burundi is a country of a thousand residences and a thousand facets with a particular emphasis on the French-speaking world, adding that the French lan-



guage is an official educational language, taught at all levels of education in the said Ministry. Mr. Burikukiye also reminded the missions of the Ministry centered, among other things, on the design, planning and execution of a coherent national policy in terms of education, technical and professional training, as well as the organization of higher education in accordance with the sectoral population in terms of education and training.

The representative of the AUF in Burundi, Mr. Fulgence Nahayo, said that the AUF is an association of the universities throughout the world, and that Burundi has 11 higher education establishments that are members of the AUF, providing training in French. He added that the AUF is alongside those universities by exploiting the method of the adapted standard, which does not come

from the dictatorial form but which comes in a consensual form with those universities in the implementation of the structural projects for the improvement of the education system in Burundi.

He also revealed that that agency has a digital campus with the training programs in French for bachelors and masters' degrees, but also research programs, and a French-speaking employability center. According to him, the AUF 2021-2025 strategy highlights five axes, namely digital transformation and university governance, employability and entrepreneurship through university youth, networking and the international cooperation, the training trainers and the educational innovation as well as the research and the valorization of the research results. For that, he announced planned competitions, including a competition called "my thesis in 180 seconds" 2024 edition open to the students where the winners will receive the prizes at the national level, an interregional competition entitled "my idea, my business" also open to the students in activity, which must end with the award ceremony at national and regional level in terms of business projects. It is in that context that he challenged the students to design the good projects linked mainly to the environment for that year.

In his presentation on "the situation of French in educational environments and perspectives", the teacher-researcher of the French department at the institute of applied pedagogy and at the same time president of the Burundian association of French

teachers, Mr. Pierre Nduwingoma, indicated that after independence the teaching of French was done in parallel with the teaching of Kirundi, therefore two languages in the educational environment. He affirmed that French is used in the administration, stressing that the daily use of this language would be around 20%.

Compared to the old college, Mr. Nduwingoma indicated that French has lost a large number of hours in the basic system. According to a work written in 2018 by researchers Mr. Athanase Nsengiyumva and Mr. Merchior Ntahondiriye on classroom practices, it was only noted that the teaching of French was carried out mainly in rural and semi-rural environments without electricity, hence the exploitation of audiovisual documents is not possible and the teaching and learning conditions are difficult. Another observation, according to that same work, is that the day school system limits the cultural initiatives such as French clubs, therefore no linguistic reinforcement. According to that research, 43.42% of teachers are neither experienced nor qualified in that study, which imposes the need for qualified teachers to teach the French language. In most schools, only one teacher taught 4 languages, which leads to the overload and the frustration. Concerning the pedagogical relationship (the relationship between the learner and the trainer), it has been observed the existence of the authoritarian type teacher where a failed learner is scolded and tends to remain silent in class. As a result, Mr. Nduwingoma pointed out the active and participatory pedagogy is not used. (ABP)

Banana wine processing units required to comply with standards



March 19, 2024, the Director General of the Burundian Bureau of Standardization

and Quality Control (BBN) Mr. Séverin Sindayikengera held a meeting with the responsible for the processing units of banana products in order to discuss the compliance with the quality standards.

Mr. Sindayikengera indicated that among 36 samples submitted for control, only six samples complied with the standards with regard to alcohol content, given that those producers were taught on technological procedures. It is in that context that the BBN organized that meeting for announcing to them that they must comply with the standards in the manufacture of that alcohol-based drink, adding that they will close the companies which have not respected standards.

According to Mr. Sindayikengera, any banana-based product that does not comply with standards, after April 19, 2024, the processing unit concerned will be permanently closed, hence the managers of these units are called upon to arrange their work in accordance with the alcohol level standards varying between 6.5 to 16.5%.

He took advantage of that opportunity to ask the Ministry in charge of commerce to collaborate with them before giving work permission to new processing units, arguing that the latter could put the bad products on the



artisanal and semi-industrial sector (ASSASIBU) of Burundi, Mr. Apollinaire Manirakiza, thanked the BBN which has just warned them of the measures it will take in the event that one or other of those processing units will not be able to meet the standards. He promised to be exemplary in their projects. Among the projects they have put forward is that of collecting plastic containers in all markets to prevent them from being used twice. He asked the BBN to always give them advice and support them in order to work well and reach far. He also promised that they will increase such meetings within the association's office to challenge their members on compliance with the standards in the processing of that product, also respecting the percentages of alcohol as they have just been announced. Mr. Manirakiza indicated that they could even issue a press release

market which would give a bad result reputation for all processing units. During the discussions, the participants, in turn, promised to collaborate and bring to the market the best products that meet the standards. They asked the Director General of the BBN to seek the solutions to the challenge of insufficient staff which is noticeable in that institution so that the grievances are responded to in time.
