take appropriate measures as soon as the results of the next general population census are published.

As for the issue related to the high cost of living, President NDAYISHIMIYE encourages his fellow Burundians to increase production to deal with it. However, he deplores the speculation of certain links in the agricultural value chain which drives up prices, which explains the disparities in prices depending on the locality.

During a lively press conference on tuesday, may 10, 2022 at the Ntare Rushatsi Presidential Palace, the Head of State His Excellency Evariste said that Burundi remains neutral and not aligned with the Russian-Ukraine NDAYISHIMIYE conflict.

Speaking of the question relating to the Russian Government's offer to provide Burundi with fuel and fertilizer support, the President of the Republic does not cut corners: "Burundi will always be part of the solutions not conflict. President of the Senate the Right Honorable Emmanuel Sinzohagera gathered on Wednesday May 11, 2022, in the Kibuye zone and in the Rushubi zone of the Isare commune, the directors and teachers of this commune. The purpose of these meetings was to assess the step taken in the education sector in Isare commune.

In his words of welcome, whether in the Kibuye zone or in Rushubi, the administrator of Isare commune Mr. Gilbert Niyonkuru indicated that Isare commune is stable in terms of peace and security,

that the population is going about their work of development. He said that on the education side, this commune ranks among the last 3 in national tests and that this sector faces a number of challenges.

The President of the Senate the Right Honorable Emmanuel Sinzohagera thanked all the teachers who were present and encouraged those who work diligently for the success of the learners.

Emmanuel Sinzohagera called on teachers to redouble their efforts in exercising their profession despite the challenges. For him, the teaching profession is not a job like any other but a vocation. And to ask the teachers of the commune of Isare to get down to work according to the theme chosen for this commune, "increase school performance class by class, course by course".

During the exchanges, the teachers raised the challenges they face including insufficient salaries as life becomes more and more expensive, dropping out of school, lack of school materials such as computers,

laboratories, books for certain classes of the post-basic cycle, etc. For these teachers, these challenges are among the factors contributing to school failure in the Isare commune.

Responding to the concerns expressed by teachers, the President of the Senate the Right Honorable Emmanuel Sinzohagera urged them to exchange experiences to increase academic performance.

Regarding the lack of school materials, the Right Honorable Emmanuel Sinzohagera said that the natives of this town will make an inventory of priority needs in order to make them available.

Regarding school dropout in Isare commune, the President of the Senate deplors this state of affairs while specifying that the State allows all children of school age to access school.

With regard to the galloping demography which could constitute an obstacle to academic success, the Right Honorable Emmanuel Sinzohagera indicated that this question is one of the national concerns. And to specify that substantial measures to deal with it will be taken based on data from the general population census of 2022. (www.rtnb.bi)

The European Union in Burundi celebrates Europe Day



On the evening of May 9, 2022, the delegation of the European Union to Burundi organized a cocktail party for the celebration of Europe Day. The Ambassadors of the Member States of the European Union accredited in Burundi were present at this event as well as other Diplomats accredited in Burundi, representatives of civil society as well as certain members of the Government, including the Burundian Minister of Foreign Affairs and Development Cooperation, H.E Ambassador Albert SHINGIRO.

In his speech, the Ambassador Delegate of the European Union to Burundi Mr. Claude BOCHOU first paid tribute to the Burundian peacekeepers who were victims of terrorism, far from their homes while serving as part of a peacekeeping mission of the African Union in Somalia. He sent his sincere and deep condolences to the people of Burundi and to the bereaved families. It was also an opportunity for this European diplomat to salute Burundi's efforts in favor of the stability of the continent.

The cooperation efforts of the Europe team in Burundi make the European Union the first donor to Burundi, a title which honors the Union, declared Ambassador Claude Bochou during

these ceremonies. Still according to Claude Bochou, the delegation will intensify its efforts in the coming months with the Burundian authorities, its headquarters, the World Bank, the IMF and the EIB in order to facilitate the mobilization of financing.

The Minister of Foreign Affairs and Development Cooperation His Excellency Ambassador Albert SHINGIRO congratulated the European Union and all its peoples by measuring at its fair value the deep significance of the Europe Day because he understood the political importance it takes on, as well as the attachment and pride of all the peoples of Europe to the achievement. He acknowledges the perseverance, determination and courage of the peoples and their leaders who have made Europe what it is today. "The unionist approach with the results achieved today is a fine example for the rest of the World. By creating the African Union, Africa wanted to demonstrate its interest in this unionist approach and its values". He added.

Minister Albert SHINGIRO recognizes that migration, terrorism and international conflicts are major challenges that risk jeopardizing the current world order. But that he is at the same time confident in the ability of nations to find adequate answers to them because they have the necessary resources and genius to do so.

The pooling of efforts by all the Member States of the United Nations to build a new world order based on the rule of international law and respectful of all countries regardless of their size, geographical location and degree of development would be one of the best ways to follow. To tackle the many collective challenges facing humanity right now without resort-

ing to wars and muscle diplomacy.

With regard to the maintenance of peace, according to Albert SHINGIRO, the phenomena of terrorism, migration, internal or inter-State conflicts do not only concern Europe, Burundi has once again been hit by Al Shabab terrorists in Somalia where the valiant peacekeepers within the African Union Transition Mission in Somalia (ATMIS) were attacked using vehicle bombs, suicide bombers and heavily armed men, causing deaths, injuries and missing persons and that it is clear that the objective of this attack is to hinder the efforts of ATMIS to bring peace and security throughout Somalia, but that the Burundian

contingent remains determined to bring the best of itself so that peace and stability finally triumph in a lasting way in this brotherly country.

Note that the European Union is present in Burundi since 1978 without interruption. Many cooperation projects have succeeded, particularly in the sectors of infrastructure, food security, health and many others. Ambassador Bochou announced on Monday during the Europe Day celebration ceremonies that the European Union will move towards areas such as climate change, justice, culture, environment and support for the youth. Opening of the retreat for National Coordinators of the ICGLR



On May 11, 2022, the National Coordinator of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region of Angola and President of the National Coordinators Amb. Miguel Caesar Domingos Bembe, the ICGLR National Coordinator of Burundi Amb. Bernard NTAHIRAJA as well as the Executive Secretary of the CIRGL Amb. Joao Samuel Caholo opened the National Coordinators retreat which will last three days at the Hotel Club du Lac Tanganyika. This retreat aims to analyze, discuss and approve the draft Strategic Plan of the ICGLR Secretariat, for the time horizon of 2022-2026. In his address, Amb. Miguel Caesar Domingos Bembe indicated that the realization of this retreat responds to the request emanating from the two meetings of the National Coordinators of the ICGLR, held face-to-face in Luanda, Republic of Angola, respectively on December 2 and 3, 2021 and by videoconference, on March 23, 2022.

Indeed, the President of the National Coordinators indicated that the retreat will be an essential exercise of review and improvement of the aforementioned draft Strategic Plan, with the aim of planning the restriction of the secretariat and its Organs, as well as to define together major regional objectives, adapted to the internal and external needs of the ICGLR and which is associated from time to time with the outline of the policies necessary for the materialization, both in terms of resources, agents, alliances and deadlines, including how to thwart possi-

ble opposition or hindrances.

Ambassador Miguel Caesar Domingos Bembe also indicated that the politico-diplomatic axes; Defense and Security; Economic and Regional Development as well as Intelligence and Reform of the Functioning and Organization of the Secretariat are the 5 strategic pillars of the strategic plan and the lines of action of Angola as President-in-Office of the ICGLR.

The President of the National Coordinators did not fail to recall that the ICGLR, like all organizations, as one of the three regional mechanisms for the prevention, management and resolution of conflicts in Africa, associated with the African Architecture of Peace and Security (APSA) and recognized by the African Union (AU) is also subject to various and permanent strategic challenges.

Therefore, he added, "it is imperative to develop an essential plan for the strategic process of application to the sequential and particular set of actions which aim to better enable the ICGLR Secretariat to determine the sequence of threats or problems to overcome and opportunities to exploit, employing potential and correcting vulnerabilities".

To end his address, Amb. Miguel Caesar Domingos Bembe said that the CIRGL continues to be an essential mechanism for the search for a solution to conflicts and guarantee of stability and development in the sub-region, it is for this reason that the national coordinators will work and support a reform of the ICGLR, in particular, of the secretariat by promoting

a new organizational structure adapted to the challenges of peace, security, stability and regional development that they face.

The ICGLR National Coordinator of Burundi Amb. Bernard NTAHIRAJA said that this retreat will allow the National Coordinators of the ICGLR, without a doubt, to reflect and discuss important subjects, relating in particular to the assets and the organization and the region, with the aim of contributing more to shared happiness of the peoples of the region. According to the Executive Secretary of the ICGLR Amb. Joao Samuel Caholo, during this retreat, the National Coordinators of the ICGLR must, together, identify the areas on which they focus. To succeed, they must be selective, systematic

and rational. They must understand the interrelated and multifaceted challenges facing the region.

To better understand the drivers of conflict and radicalization, the factors that hinder economic growth and job creation for young people and women in the region. At the practical level, they need to understand and decide how they will engage with all member states to find durable solutions.

The ICGLR Executive Secretary also indicated that ICGLR National Coordinators must make difficult but necessary choices for the Conference Secretariat to effectively fulfill its mandate and remain relevant to the region. They must engage in sustained engagements that allow them to both identify and unlock blockages that prevent the ICGLR from fulfilling its mandate.(MFADC)

The Russian Embassy in Burundi celebrates the 77th anniversary of the end of the war in Europe



Russia joined the world on Monday May 9, 2022 to celebrate the 77th anniversary of the end of the war in Europe. In Russia, it is called the great patriotic war, said the ambassador of the Russian Federation Valery Mikhaylov during a press briefing.

Embassy officials participated in the so-called "Immortal Regime" activity which took place in front of the Embassy, very close to the monument of the first man in space Mr. Yuri Gagarin. As indicated by the Ambassador of the Russian Federation in Burundi Valéry Mikhay-

lov, this activity aims to honor the memory of their grandfathers who lost their lives or who participated in the Second World War.

The Ambassador of the Russian Federation said that for several years, Russia has presented annually to the UN General Assembly a resolution that condemns all forms of racism or other discriminatory practices. But 77 years after the victory, Russia was once again forced to confront Nazism and militarism in Europe, said the Ambassador of the Russian Federation to Burundi.

Unfortunately for Russia, continued Valery Mikhaylov, the realization of the right to defend the interests resulted from a reaction of the Western countries which already imposed 5 series of sanctions against Russia like financial systems, food and energy products, said the ambassador.

Valery Mikhaylov said that as part of strengthening close and friendly ties with Burundi, Russia is currently working on solving logistical problems related to the possible delivery to Burundi of fertilizers, fuel and medicines. (www.rtnb.bi)
